The U.S. Constitution:

The Constitution is a prison within which we have bound our federal government.

"Congress has not unlimited powers to provide for the general welfare, but only those specifically enumerated." - Thomas Jefferson

In addition to a few internal powers, the Constitution limits our federal government to performing only eleven essential tasks, as clearly enumerated in Article 1, Section 8 and reaffirmed by the 10th Amendment.

- 2. Borrow Money
- 3. Regulate Commerce
- 4. Immigration
- 5. Bankruptcies
- 6. Print Money

- 7. Punish Counterfeiting
- 8. Post Office
- 9. Patent Office
- 10. Establish Lower Courts
- 11. Defense

The 10th Amendment: <u>The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution,</u> nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.

"When so ever the General (Federal) Government assumes undelegated powers, its acts are unauthoritative, void, and of no force." - Thomas Jefferson

Marbury v. Madison (1803) (Marshall, C. J.) "The powers of the legislature are defined, and limited; and that those limits may not be mistaken, or forgotten, the Constitution is written."

"The powers delegated by the proposed Constitution to the federal government are few and defined. Those which are to remain in the State governments are numerous and indefinite. NULLIFICATION:

The federal government cannot break the law. Neither can the states, nor anyone (federal, state, county, or local government employee) that has sworn an oath to *obey* and *defend* the highest Law in our nation.

When anyone, including our government, breaks the law, no reasonable person would expect the resulting illegal activity to become law and to be obeyed.

The responsibility of a free people is to disregard and disobey such activity in order to maintain their freedom and the rule of law, but we have not done so.

Degree by degree they have conquered us. The fact that we have been dutifully and fearfully obeying and subsidizing an endless stream of illegal government activity and no longer questioning whether we should disobey, is proof that our Founders were correct in locking our federal and state governments within constitutional prisons.

The federal government is limited to eleven general tasks. That is clear.

It is also evident that out states have not protected us from illegal federal activity, with a few amazing exceptions from states like New Hampshire, Wyoming, South Carolina, etc.

Instead, our states have gotten into bed with the federal government, betraying the public trust, the law, their oaths, and our nation.

"If money is wanted by Rulers who have in any manner oppressed the People, they may retain it until their grievances are redressed, and thus peaceably procure relief, without trusting to despised petitions or disturbing the public tranquility."

Oath to the Constitution:
